#### **POISONING OUR CHILDREN!**

Public Backlash, Communism

- · Rock stars seen as a bad influence
  - Elvis' gyrations
  - Jerry Lee Lewis marriage scandal
  - · Chuck Berry imprisoned
- Parents feared teens' increasing independence
- Well-defined racial lines in 50's America
  - The White middle class felt threatened by Black influence
  - Rock's connection to R&B heightened this

#### **Indecent Behavior**

- 1953 & 1954: Sen. Joe McCarthy's PSI hearings
  - Communism witch-hunts
  - Inspired national fear of Communist plots
- A fear-driven public connected Rock with Communism
  - Rock was seen as "mind-control" on teens
    - · "Entranced dancing"
    - "Rhythmic, sexually charged beats"

#### **ROCK GOES TO WASHINGTON**

Congress and the Payola Scandals

- Payola: "Pay for Play" to get on radio stations
  - A legal practice, dating back to Tin Pan Alley
  - A way for Indies to compete for airplay
- The mood of 1958
  - Public outcry over Rock's "immorality"
  - Fear of Communism running rampant
  - An election year
  - ...primed for a scandal



#### **The Payola Scandals**

- The involved parties:
  - <u>A</u>merican <u>Society of <u>C</u>omposers, <u>A</u>uthors & <u>P</u>ublishers</u>
    - Favored White, Major-Label artists and live concerts
    - Held most music licenses pre-1945
  - Broadcast Music Incorporated
    - Represented Indie artists (Rock, R&B, Country)
    - By 1955, licensed 80% of all music on the radio
- ASCAP saw Rock as immoral, bad for business
  - They leveraged Congress to hurt BMI

#### **ASCAP vs. BMI**

- At ASCAP's urging, Congress held Payola hearings
  - DJs, radio execs called to testify
  - Alan Freed: defiant, fired and blacklisted from radio
  - Dick Clark: apologetic, awarded American Bandstand
- The aftermath:
  - Payola was redefined as bribery
  - Indies lost competitive leverage
  - DJs stripped of power

#### THE DAY THE MUSIC DIED


The Disappearance of Rock's First Icons

- 1956
  - Carl Perkins' career is postponed over a car crash
- 1957
  - Little Richard retires to become a minister
  - Jerry Lee Lewis faces controversy over his 14 year-old wife
  - The Everly Brothers face bans over "Wake Up Little Suzie"
- 1958
  - Elvis Presley is drafted into the Army
- 1959
  - Chuck Berry is imprisoned over MANN Act charges
  - Buddy Holly dies in a plane crash "The Day the Music Died"

#### Where are they now?

- Rock's public image
  - Immoral and corrupting U.S. youth
  - A "mind-controlling" Communist plot
- The business side
  - Rock's licensing agency BMI attacked by Congress
  - Payola, the main tool of Indie promotion declared illegal
- The performers
  - By 1959, most were retired, in jail or dead
